

ACF Students & Leaders Preparing to Come to Canada

As the ACF students and leaders prepare to come to Canada for the 2023 NAD ACF Institute, they should be sure to travel with their passports.



Lawful permanent residents of the United States who hold valid status in the U.S. are exempt from the eTA requirement. They must carry official proof of status (or an equivalent status document) and a valid passport from their country of nationality (or an equivalent travel document). Some people may need an **Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA)**. The online application for an eTA will cost \$7. Those that apply for the eTA must be sure to print their receipt and retain it. They won't be able to print it later or receive a copy. So, who needs an eTA to travel to Canada?
